

<i><u>Type of Incident</u></i>	<i><u>Description</u></i>
Alarm Activation	Smoke detector, carbon monoxide alarm or sprinkler activation.
Fire	Any type of fire; typical types encountered by the fire department include building, chimney, dumpster, vehicle, brush, or cooking fires.
Good Intent Call	No incident found on arrival, for example, investigation of smoke in the area, unusual or unknown odor.
Hazardous Condition (no fire)	Calls including but not limited to combustible or flammable substances, such as gasoline or propane, natural gas leaks, chemical spills, carbon monoxide incidents, down power lines, electrical problem, or an explosion without fire caused by steam, gas or chemical reaction.
Rescue and Emergency Medical Service Incident	Includes responses to car accidents with injury and/or entrapment, search for lost individuals, water or ice rescues, and removal of trapped individuals from a stalled elevator.
Service Call	Non-emergency requests for assistance for lockouts, water problems, smoke removal or to assist the police or other government agency.
Severe Weather and Natural Disaster Call	Responses related to lightning strike, severe weather, or natural disaster. Also includes assessment of such incidents and station standby for coverage in anticipation of severe weather.
Other	Activities such as alarm system testing, public education, administrative or other miscellaneous incident types.
